

## RULES & REGULATIONS

Grange Fair is made up of several thousands of individuals with wide varying ideas of a good time. These Camp Rules are designed to limit certain very common sources of annoyance. Please read and observe them. Additional rules that apply are also printed in the Grange Fair premium brochure.

1. All exhibitors **MUST BE COMPLETELY MOVED IN AND SET UP BY 10:00 AM, AUGUST 26<sup>th</sup>**. After moving in, all vehicles must be parked in the designated parking lot for concessionaires. All vehicles in this area must have a Concession card in the window. They are available from the Concession Office. Your vehicle cannot be left in the camping area.
2. Foul and abusive language will not be tolerated.
3. No concession will be allowed to operate a JACKPOT.
4. **GLASS BOTTLES ARE NOT ALLOWED**. Drinks must be sold in cans, paper or plastic.
5. **NO PETS ARE ALLOWED ON THE GROUNDS AT ANY TIME**. (Exception: visually impaired)
6. **ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ARE NOT ALLOWED ON THE GROUNDS AT ANY TIME**.
7. **OPEN FIRES ARE NOT ALLOWED IN ANY AREA DURING THE FAIR**.
8. No one is allowed to sell or give away as prizes any small animals i.e. rabbits, crab, etc.
9. Positively **NO SMOKING** in any building on the fairgrounds.
10. For safety reasons, the use of bicycles, rollerskates, rollerblades, skateboards, scooters, radio controlled toys, and other ridden toys are forbidden throughout the Grange Park. This also includes motorized scooters, skateboards, motorcycles, etc.
11. **NO KNIFE GAMES. KNIVES CANNOT BE GIVEN AS PRIZES**. The only knives that can be sold are those for kitchen use and then only to those who are older than 21 years of age. If in violation, they will be confiscated either by the Concession Department, or Security Personnel.
12. All authorized motorized vehicles on the fair grounds must be driven by a licensed driver. Farm equipment will not be allowed to be driven on the fairgrounds or in the parade unless operated by a licensed driver.
13. Sleeping in vans, pick-ups, other types of vehicles or tents **in the parking lots** is prohibited.
14. All campers are to be in their tents or trailers by the 1:00 a.m. curfew. The use of car horns, whistles, playing of radios or TV's either in tents, trailers, or concessions between the hours of 1:00 a.m. to 7:00 a.m. is prohibited. Loitering is prohibited during these hours. Curfew is in effect.
15. All radios, PA systems, boomboxes, etc. that are in game trailers or concession stands **MUST BE KEPT AT A REASONABLE SOUND LEVEL**. If complaints are received, a warning will be given and further problems will result in the confiscation of the device and if necessary, the concession will be shut down, along with possible loss of space. Foul and abusive language will not be tolerated.
16. **NO WOODEN FLOORS ARE PROVIDED**. Tables and benches owned by the fair will be available on a first come first serve basis.
17. **PRODUCT DELIVERIES MUST BE MADE TO THE CONCESSION AREA BY 12 NOON EACH DAY**. These can come through Gate 2 starting August 26<sup>th</sup> until NOON. Gate 4 will be open starting Saturday, August 21, 8:00 a.m. and 24 hours/day thereafter for the duration. Special arrangements can be made by contacting the Concession Secretary. All package deliveries-DHL, FEDEX, UPS and mail must come through Gate 4 and picked up at the Maintenance Building.
18. **Concessions are reminded to clean up in front of their stand by 8:00 a.m. each day**. All boxes for disposal must be broken down and flattened and put in the recycle bins. **COOKING OIL** for disposal must be placed in a non-leaking container with lids and placed in front of your stand for pickup and proper disposal. Do not put cooking oils into the holding tanks or you will lose your space permanently.
19. Food vendors must meet the food and refrigeration requirements as well as other Rules & Regulations outlined by the Department of Agriculture. Current food handler licenses are required. The Department will be inspecting your food stand and your food handling license must be clearly displayed at all times.
20. **No exhibitor will be allowed to move out until 1:00 a.m. Friday morning, September 3<sup>rd</sup>**. If you pull posts or other structures to exit earlier; you will be charged to replace them and face disciplinary action. Any trouble will result in the loss of your space permanently. The Concession Dept. may dismiss you earlier depending on crowd, parking lot and gate conditions. Please be patient.
21. All stands, exhibits and equipment must be removed from the grounds by September 9<sup>th</sup>. Storage fees and arrangements can be made with the Concession Department. All other items not previously arranged for with the Concession Department will become the property of the fair and disposed of at their discretion.
22. Gates will be open after the fair on September 3 until 7:30 p.m. and Saturday, September 4 from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., closed Sunday and Monday and will re-open Tuesday, September 7 from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. daily except weekends.
23. Use of golf carts and other similar vehicles on the fairgrounds is a privilege and may be used on a limited delivery basis by Concessionaires from 6:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon only. They must be registered and driven by a licensed driver. They are only to be used to transport supplies to and from your concession and not through other areas of the fairgrounds.

24. Bag bombs and devices that expels a projectile i.e. (cap guns, caps or similar types of explosive device, water pistols or dart guns, pea shooters, stink bombs, laser pointers, spray aerosol items of any description silly string, hair color, etc.) will not be allowed to be either sold or given as prizes.
25. Complaints of unfair practices by concessionaires will be handled by the Concession Department and the concession secretary's decision will be final.
26. Concession parking passes must be displayed on all concession vehicles at all times.
27. Improperly parked vehicles will be towed away at the owner's expense. The fair will not be liable under any circumstances for injury to persons or damage to property of the owner or occupant of any vehicle or for any property damage or loss of any nature. The Centre County Grange Fair shall be held harmless.
28. The fair reserves the right to relocate any exhibit and/or make adjustments of space allotments as it sees necessary in the interest of the fair.
29. Tobacco products (smoke or smokeless) cannot be sold to minors. Cigarette vending machines are prohibited. Candy cigarettes or other types of devices that simulate a cigarette, pipe, cigar, etc. cannot be sold on the grounds.
30. No flat store, alibi, no bushel basket or build-ups.
31. Any type of drug related paraphernalia is prohibited.
32. Fire arms of any type, cross bows, swords or other similar devices or any types of projectile weapons are prohibited on the grounds.
33. The concession department reserves the right to limit the sale of items deemed to be a hazard or harmful to those in attendance.
34. Those who contract buildings and store materials within them during the off-season period are liable for storage costs based on the square footage of the building. All building storage must be handled through the Concession Department. Storage costs must be paid before the last day of the fair or the fair reserves the right to dispose of remaining items in any manner we see fit. The fair assumes no responsibility for stored items, nor do we carry insurance on items left in a building or stored at the fair.
35. All tents, canopies, lights/poles used as part of the concession must be securely (pinned) fastened to the ground.
36. No changes to the landscape, grade, (excavation, holes or removal of soil) shall take place without the permission of the Concession Department. Depending on set up, a deposit may be requested to insure the grounds are returned to their original state. All concession space must be returned to its original state following the fair no later than **September 9, 2010**. Any costs to return a space to its original condition expended by the fair as a result of your concession will be your responsibility to pay or loose your space.
37. All concessions must keep their materials and game items on their rented concession space and not allow them to interfere with adjacent concessions. If a net is required, it is your responsibility to have it installed. All damages and associated costs are your responsibility. Any unsafe practices will result in your concession being closed down and must be corrected before opening.
38. The number of helper permitted campers may be limited by the concession department depending on the size of your concession space. All helper campers must be a working employee of your concession and actively participating.
39. All hauling trailers and trucks not used in your daily operation or concession operation after unloading must be stored along the exterior fence between Gate 3 and the large blue waste tank by the barns. Do not store by the tractor pull or concession parking lot.
40. After your camper is parked you must move your vehicle out of the camping area to the adjacent concession parking area. Under no circumstances are your vehicles to be left in the camping area during the day or at night.
41. On Sunday, August 29, 2010 only food vendors can open before 12:00 noon. All other vendors including rides and exhibit buildings can open after 12:00 noon.
42. We will again be recycling. The cardboard in particular will need to be placed in the special containers. We are working to provide additional material containers as we find locations. We ask for your assistance in this matter.
